OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAMME:

- To increase public understanding of the dangers and consequences of drug addiction and abuse.
- To raise awareness about the factors that contribute to drug abuse, such as peer pressure, stress, and mental health issues.
- To promote healthy lifestyle choices and coping mechanisms to prevent the initiation of drug use.

REPORT OF THE PROGRAMME:

On 13.04.2022 an awareness program on drug addiction and drug abuse was organized by Dr. C. Pavithra, WEC Coordinator. The event aimed to educate and sensitize the participants, including 180 students, about the critical issues surrounding drug addiction. The event was graced by esteemed guests, including Dr. Y. Rajasekar, Principal, President of the Program. He emphasized the importance of community involvement in combating drug abuse. Dr. Sindhu, Jr. Civil Judge from Punganur, shed light on the legal aspects and consequences of drug-related offenses. Dr. M. Veeramohan Reddy, Bar Association President, Punganur shared valuable insights from a medical perspective, emphasizing the health risks associated with drug abuse. Sri Uma Maheshwara Rao, Sub-Inspector of Police, Punganur, addressed the role of law enforcement in curbing the drug menace. The program witnessed active participation from 180 students, who engaged in discussions to enhance their understanding of the subject. The students' enthusiasm and willingness to learn reflected a collective commitment to creating a drug-free community. Finally the programme concluded with vote of thanks proposed by p.
